

OK This is what is hardest !!!

Step 1: LEARN IT !!!

You have to turn the study cards into memories/hard learning – different methods work for different people.

- a. Remember the number of points you have per topic.
- b. Use a mnemonic **Every Good Boy Deserves Favour** (Music EGBDF)-rhymes or phrases ..only one S in a letter (Dear Sir – faithfully/ Dear Mr – sincerely)...I practi**S**e my **S**inging... DR.VAN-MENTRAPS(French etre verbs).
- c. Coloured cards per subject – post-it notes on a massive sheet of paper.

Step 2: TEST YOURSELF !!!

You have to test whether or not you have actually learnt something – and the only way to do this is to test yourself – **really test!**

- a. Put away the notes – practise using a past paper question or the questions in revision guides.
- b. You have to be tough on yourself – we know from bitter experience just how tough examiners are!
- c. Jot down the key points or key terminology before you start to write, then check them off at the end – SPELLING has to be correct !!

Step 3: MARK IT / CHECK IT !!

- a. Did you get it right – honestly?
- b. Did you get the key facts/words in
- c. What do you need to revisit and relearn?...put it into your revision schedule!!!
